Arrival and structure of the day

The time listed on your interview invite is your **arrival time**. This is set as 30 minutes before your interview start time, so you can complete registration and have a chance to get settled before you are taken for your interview.

Should you be running late / unable to attend on the day please let the <u>Interviews Team</u> know as soon as possible.

On arrival please **report to the Interview Registration Desk** on the ground floor of <u>the</u> <u>Learning Hub</u>.

During the day, you will be able to have your documents checked with Admissions, take a tour of the Campus, speak to current students about what it's like to study here, view on-campus accommodation, visit the Students' Union and drop in with our Student Services team and Employability team to get your queries answered.

Our cafés and restaurants will be open for you to grab a bite to eat throughout the day, and the town centre is a short 10-minute walk through Becket's Park, so be sure to explore during your visit.

Guests are welcome to accompany you to the campus but will need to collect a visitor pass on arrival at registration. Guests are welcome on our tours and drop-in sessions, and can make use of the cafés whilst they wait for you to finish your interview.

If you would like a guided campus tour during your visit, these are available at 11:30am and 3pm. You are more than welcome to arrive before your arrival time to attend a tour before your interview, or you can attend one after your interview (please bear in mind what time your interview will finish to ensure you can attend!)

Please read the information below and ensure that you have all the documents (originals and copies) ready for checking. If you do not have any of the original certificates, then please arrange to get copies from exam boards – enrolment will not be possible unless original certificates are seen.

Preparation for interview

All applicants for EYTS must be deemed suitable for the programme. The University of Northampton Partnership will conduct interviews to assess if you have the appropriate intellectual and academic capabilities and personal qualities, attitudes, ethics and values to meet the Teachers' Standards (early years). The interview involves a planning task and an individual interview. Please allow up to three hours for the interview process.

1. Your planning task

You will be placed in small groups of 4-6 for this task. This task is unseen and no resources or pre-planning is necessary. It will be helpful to you if you have some understanding of the Early Years Foundation Stage framework. You will be asked to give a short rationale for the reasoning behind your planning.

Please note: there will be no access to ICT (no laptops) during the teaching session.

This aspect of the process focuses on your:

- Ability to prepare for learning and self-organization
- Ability to communicate and interpersonal style
- Understanding of the EYFS, how children learn and child development

2. Individual interview

This part of the interview process will be led by a university tutor and usually a head teacher from a local Partnership school or nursery. You will have approximately a 10 to 15 minute interview through which the interviewers will assess your:

- Commitment to teaching and working with young children
- Ability to reflect on personal learning
- Interest in and knowledge of the Early Years Foundation stage and how children learn.

Special Park and Ride interview day discount

Applicants attending an interview and their guests can receive a discounted Park and Ride fare to travel to campus on the day of their interview. The discounted rate is £1.20 per person for a return journey. Cash and contactless payments are accepted. Parking is free of charge.

In order to claim this discount, when you arrive at the Park and Ride car park, you will need to report to the security cabin, show your interview invite email and collect your Interview Pass. Please ensure you leave enough time to do this as there may be queues during peak periods (between 11am and 2.30pm).



The image to the left shows the security cabin that you need to look out for. It is near the entrance to the car park. **You must show your Interview Pass to the bus driver on both your journeys to gain your discounted travel so please keep it with you.** If you cannot show your interview invite email at the security cabin at the Park and Ride car park, they will not be able to issue you with an Interview Pass and you and your guests will need to pay the full fare.

Photographic Identification

On the interview day please bring with you to the Interview Registration Desk an original piece of photographic identification. The documents most commonly used are:

- Original valid passport
- Photographic drivers licence card

Qualifications

- During your interview day you will need to take your qualifications to Admissions who will be based at the Student Information Desk on the ground floor of the Learning Hub.
- You will need to bring your original GCSE English Language, Mathematics and Science certificates to the interview day. Please also provide a photocopy of each of the above.
- If you have already achieved a degree, you will need to bring the original certificate and a photocopy.
- It is extremely important to present your original certificates at this point to help us process your application as quickly as possible.
- Results slips will be acceptable at the interview stage, but original certificates will be required prior to enrolment.
- You will not be able to enrol until all original documents have been seen.
- If you have any equivalent level 2 qualifications, then please declare this via email to <u>admissions2019@northampton.ac.uk</u> before interview so that they can be checked.

Requests for reasonable adjustment

It is the policy of the University of Northampton that candidates should not be prejudiced as a result of any disability and reasonable adjustments will be made to mitigate unfair discrimination.

Please note you will be required to provide suitable medical evidence that confirms the nature of your condition and the need for adjustment.

Other documentation

- If you work with children or vulnerable adults you must have clearance from the Disclosure and Barring Service which must be in the form of an Enhanced Disclosure.
- The DBS must be completed online by 30 June 2019.
- Please **do not** bring any DBS documents to the interview day. We will contact you via email of how to do this after you have made us your firm choice.
- You will need to complete a new DBS check application even if you have a current CRB/DBS certificate (unless otherwise stated).
- Any offer from us is conditional upon such clearance and you are unable to enrol until this is returned.

If you meet our entry requirements but have a caution or conviction on your DBS then we may require you to attend another interview or provide us with more information. We will contact you at a later date advising what is required. Please note, specific cautions and convictions may lead to an automatic decline. Literacy and Numeracy Professional Skills tests

- All trainee teachers must pass the Literacy and Numeracy Professional Skills tests before enrolment onto the programme.
- These need to be passed by 30 June 2019 at the latest.
- You will be asked at the interview if you have organised to attend a test centre and if you have attempted the practice tests.
- You will need to provide a copy of the forms when you have passed.
