

ACCOMMODATION.



Moving overseas is a big step, so it helps if you don't need to worry about where you'll be living. With over 2,200 bed spaces, our Halls of Residence offer all you need to relax, make friends, socialise and study. We take your safety seriously, so all sites have 24-hour security and a dedicated Residential Life Team to support you through any issues you may have.


What's the deal?

Rents range from £82 - £162* per person, per week, for 43 weeks - significantly less expensive than in many UK university locations. Accommodation is fully furnished, with all utilities, personal possessions insurance and University computer network and WiFi access included - so no surprise costs! All that's left for you to pay is for a licence to watch TV if you bring one for your own room.

Choose the location and accommodation type to suit your budget

Most students love the convenience of living on-campus during their first year. Our new student village is just a few metres from the academic buildings. You might choose a single occupancy or shared flat, or perhaps you would prefer one of the four-storey townhouses with landscaped courtyards.

St John's Halls are located on the edge of Northampton's Cultural Quarter, a short walk from campus, whilst our Boughton Green Road Student Village offers a budget option with a free bus service to campus.



Private sector accommodation

If you prefer to live in private rented accommodation, our Student Lets Team will provide details of available properties that meet our high safety standards. You can expect to pay between £80 and £150 per week, depending on location and facilities.

*2019-20 rates - prices will be subject to an increase for the 2020-21 academic year. A £300 Key and Damage Deposit is payable when you accept the offer of a room.



ENTRY REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLICANTS FROM LITHUANIA.

If you apply during your final year at school or university, we'll make a conditional offer based on your application and predicted results. If your previous studies were in English, you may not need to take an additional English Language test. You'll need to provide evidence of this, but we can't guarantee an exemption. Some courses require previous study in a relevant field or have additional requirements, including tasks, interviews or higher levels of English Language competence.

HOW MUCH WILL IT COST?

Tuition fees

Tuition fees usually include teaching costs, registration fees and examination fees. Some courses may have additional examination charges for professional bodies or additional qualifications – please check the relevant course page of our website. If there are compulsory study trips on your course, these costs will be included.

Undergraduate tuition fees for 2020 entry will be confirmed during September 2019.

Postgraduate fees for EU students vary depending on the course. Please visit northampton.ac.uk for details of all our courses and fees.

HOW TO APPLY.

Once you've decided that you would like to study with us, our aim is to make the application process as straightforward as possible. So we can consider your application, you'll need to include the following documentation:

Your education history

Tell us where you studied, what qualifications you already have and include copies of your certificates or transcripts. If you have studies you've not yet completed, include your predicted result, then send us your final results as soon as you have them.

Proof of English language competence

Please check the course-specific requirements on our website.

A Personal Statement

Explain why you would like to study your chosen course and what you plan to do with your qualification.

A reference or letter of recommendation

If you're still studying or have recently completed your studies, this should be from one of your teachers, explaining your academic potential and suitability for the course. If you're in work, this should be from your employer.

Making your application

Option one:
