Welcome to the University of Northampton

We would like to take this opportunity to welcome you to your studies at the University of Northampton. The purpose of this document is to help you prepare for coming to study with us and give you an opportunity to meet members of your module team as well as other students who are undertaking the same course. We want to make sure that you are inspired, anchored, prepared, and enabled to succeed.

Through engaging with our welcome and induction activities you will get to know the University, your super-supportive tutors, have a chance to meet colleagues also on the module and be able to access what you need to know and do to start studying successfully. Ultimately, we want you to feel confident about how you will learn.

Remote Enrolments

To enrol, students will be required to undertake the following:

- 1. Compete pre-enrolment including the uploading of photographic identification (e.g. passport or drivers licence) and a passport style photo
- 2. Note: If students have no outstanding blocking sanctions, then their enrolment will be processed remotely. However, if students have blocking sanctions they will need to resolve these with the relevant team before the enrolment can be processed
- 3. When a student's enrolment has been processed they will receive an enrolment confirmation via email and will then be able to commence engaging in their studies

Student ID Cards

As you are undertaking a remote learning module you will not be required to obtain a student ID card from the Student Information Desk (SID).

If you are permitted to attend campus you will be able to obtain their student card from SID, ground floor Learning Hub, Waterside, University Drive, Northampton (Monday to Friday: 8.30-11.00 and 14.00-16.30)

If you have completed the online application process you should receive emails from admissions detailing the pre-enrolment/ enrolment approach by 23rd April 2021 so please check your inboxes (this may end up in your junk box). The <u>new students</u> and <u>enrolment webpages</u> have detailed information on the enrolment approach.

Module Timetable

Preparing you for Learning and Teaching at Northampton

Learning and teaching at the University of Northampton is designed to help you take control of your own learning, using small group teaching, team-working and one-to-one tutorials that allow learning to take place in face-to-face virtual environments and using carefully crafted digital experiences. To help you prepare for this personalised approach to learning, our welcome and induction activities are designed to introduce you to our learning technologies so that you are ready to go for the start of term. Through engaging in some preparatory work before our live sessions, you can think about some of the questions you might have and have opportunities to explore the many ways in which you are supported.

What to do if you can't attend any live sessions

If you are unable to attend live sessions, we will be sharing any resources used on our module <u>NILE</u> site (the **N**orthampton Integrated **L**earning **E**nvironment). You will be able to access these once you have enrolled. Just let the session facilitator or the module leader know via email that you cannot attend.

Technical Support

As part of our welcome and induction, we would like you to engage with us using our online tool, Blackboard Collaborate. It is broadly like using Skype or Zoom, which you may have come across before. Following enrolment, you will gain access to your module NILE site NURM116. Don't worry if by day one you cannot get onto the module NILE site-You will be able to join your Welcome and Induction session as a guest, meaning that you do not need to create an account to participate. However, for subsequent sessions you must ensure that you have access to the module NILE site.

Using Collaborate

- 1) Test whether your browser will work with Collaborate
- 2) Review the <u>student guide to using Collaborate</u>
- 3) Test Collaborate by visiting our test 'classroom' to address any technological challenges. This classroom will be available 24/7 from now until day one of your module. You can join the classroom now and follow the instructions to test your audio and video functions.

- <u>The Student Information Desk</u> who can signpost you to our specialist support services
- The University of Northampton <u>Students' Union</u> for clubs and societies, sports and other social activities, as well as support, information and guidance

During the online sessions you will have an opportunity to ask those questions that you haven't yet found an answer to. In preparation, you might like to think about what undertaking this module means for you in particular – your hopes and expectations and what you might find challenging. Don't worry – you only need share what you are comfortable to talk about.

What Happens Next?

- 1) We will ensure that all students are allocated to a <u>Personal Tutor</u> group- your module leader will identify who yours is and post a list on your NILE site.
 - At UON, our Personal Tutors meet regularly with their tutees, both in group and in 1-to-1 sessions. They will help you to reflect on how your studies are going and explore actions you can take to maximise your chances of success. Please contact your personal tutor directly if you have any questions about personalised support that have not been addressed during induction.
- 2) Make sure that you complete your enrolment to gain access to your NILE account- the module NILE site for NURM116 should be available to you. You will then also be able to access your timetable detailing your sessions for the rest of the term.
