The Reverend Richard Coles The Chancellor.



Reverend Richard Coles was born in Northampton and educated at Wellingborough School and later King's College London, where he studied Theology. He holds an MA by research from the University of Leads

Ordained in 2005, Reverend Coles is Vicar of St Mary the Virgin in Finedon in the Diocese of Peterborough. He combines this with a career as a radio broadcaster and television presenter. He co-presents BBC Radio 4's Saturday Live show and is a regular guest on flagship television shows such as Have I Got News for You and QI.

Reverend Coles was a contestant on the BBC's Strictly Come Dancing in 2017. Since 2014 he has appeared regularly in the Pause for Thought slot on the BBC Radio 2 Breakfast Show and in the summer of 2016 took part in the BBC's prime-time programme Celebrity Masterchef. Most recently he co-presented The Big Painting Challenge on BBC One. Reverend Coles was also one half of 1980s pop duo, The Communards, with whom he had three top ten hits.

In addition, he has a keen interest in social enterprise, particularly in the field of housing. He serves as a board member of Wellingborough Homes, which provides social and affordable housing in the area.

To date, Reverend Coles has published four books, two volumes of autobiography, *Fathomless Riches* and *Into the Harvest* and two volumes of the lives of lesser-known saints, *Lives of the Improbable Saints* and *Legends of the Improbable Saints*.

Reverend Coles received an honorary doctorate from the University in 2012.

Vice Chancellor's Welcome.

The University of Northampton, through its antecedent institutions, has a long and distinguished history and today is a vibrant institution with over 14,000 students from over 100 countries around the world, 2,000 staff and an annual turnover of over £125m.

In addition to extensive undergraduate, postgraduate and research degrees, the University offers professional training in a wide range of disciplines related to the employment needs of the region. We welcome part-time students and adult learners undertaking professional and career development. Professor Nick Petford DSc DL Vice Chancellor The University of Northampton

Nick Petford The Vice Chancellor.



Professor Nick Petford is Vice Chancellor and CEO of the University of Northampton. Nick is a former Royal Society University Research Fellow and Fellow of Churchill College, Cambridge. A geologist by training, with a DSc from the University of Liverpool, Nick has worked in industry and on academic and commercial research projects throughout the world. He has held visiting research appointments at the Universities of Michigan and Vermont and NASA and is currently visiting professor at Macquarie University, Sydney. He is a graduate of Harvard Business School.

Nick is known internationally for his expertise in volcanoes and is a highly cited author with over 250 journal papers, abstracts, book reviews and other articles to his name (some from a brief stint as a journalist at the Times Higher). His research work embraces field investigations and mathematical modelling of the flow of molten rock on earth and other planets, and the mechanical stability of volcanoes. He has worked with colleagues at JPL on the physics of ice magma and by extension published research work on the fluid dynamics of blood flow.

Nick is also an occasional science broadcaster and has appeared in documentaries for the BBC, Channel 4, National Geographic and The Weather Channel. Contributions include Krakatoa Revealed (2006), The Volcano That Stopped the World (2010), The Birth of Britain (2011), The Birth of Europe (2012), Top Ten Natural Disasters (2014) and for WAGTV What on Earth (2016).

Nick is currently championing social enterprise and social entrepreneurship across the UK university sector and beyond. Partners include Social Enterprise UK, Big Society Capital, UnLtd and the Social Economy Alliance. He has worked with the UK Cabinet Office to promote social value in procurement and more recently with John Bird, founder of the Big Issue, on creating a 'Social Echo' in Northampton. Overseas activity in this area includes collaborations with the British Council in South Korea and India. In 2013 he led the University of Northampton to become the first Ashoka U Changemaker Campus in the UK. In 2017 the University was awarded the Social Enterprise Gold Mark in recognition of practitioner excellence.

Nick has extensive experience serving on professional bodies at Board level. He is Chair of the Northamptonshire Health and Wellbeing Board, Board member of the Universities and Colleges Employers' Association and UnLtd, the foundation for social entrepreneurs. He is a Fellow of the Geological Society of London, Royal Society of the Arts and American Geophysical Union. He is also a Director of Floodstop, a university spin-out company that manufactures and sells flood defence barriers and Non-Executive Director of Starcrest Education. Nick was appointed as a Deputy Lieutenant of Northamptonshire in October 2019.



David Laing Pro Chancellor.

David was born into the Laing construction family. He qualified as an architect and subsequently worked with Sir Basil Spence's London firm before setting up a private practice in Hertfordshire, as well as becoming a partner in GHM Rock Townsend.

With his knowledge of the construction industry, David became chairman of Country and Metropolitan and has been a director of Eskmuir, a quoted property company which was taken private and is the Laing family's property vehicle. As well as being a director of a number of private companies, he has served as a trustee, Chairman, or President, of many charities including the Northamptonshire Community Foundation, the Northamptonshire Association of Youth Clubs and Adrenaline Alley, the biggest urban sports park in the UK.

David was Lord Lieutenant of Northamptonshire from 2014-2020.

He has had experience in the leisure sector, as well as agriculture, being hands-on at his farm at Brigstock, Northamptonshire. He has been living in the county for over ten years and is committed to making it known as the Heart of England.



Mark Mulcahey The Chair, Board of Governors.

Mark Mulcahey is an experienced strategy consultant who has worked for some of the world's leading companies developing board-level strategy. Having specialised initially in telecommunications, he was Managing Director of both Arthur D Little and Adventis in Europe and China. Mark currently works in the UK supporting regional government transformation.

Mark's international experience spans Europe, North America, China, Japan and Australasia, and includes supporting new telecommunications infrastructure, startup initiatives, mobile strategy and acquisitions.

Mark has been a visiting fellow in the Faculty of Business and Law and still occasionally delivers lectures on strategic partnerships to MBA students.

He is a member of Northamptonshire Scouts County Executive and was previously a Northampton school governor. Mark was born in Liverpool but has lived in Northamptonshire for 30 years.

The History of the University of Northampton.

Between 1261 and 1265, Northampton was sanctioned by Henry III as an alternative place of study for hundreds of students displaced from Oxford and Cambridge universities during a period of civil unrest. Had it not been for a mischievous complaint to the King that the creation of a rival university would dilute the quality of education at Oxford, Northampton might have been England's third university.

The contemporary University of Northampton's roots lies firmly in the late 19th century, when new educational initiatives in science, technology and art education were developed to help support the needs of the region's industries. Science and technology found their first formal home in the old Northampton Grammar School premises at Abington Square in 1911, while art settled in nearby premises in Abington Street.

By 1924 plans were underway for a purpose-built College of Technology on St George's Avenue Campus, which formally opened in 1932. The College of Art opened a purpose-built wing at the same site in 1937. At the time it was hoped this would be a basis for the beginnings of a university in Northampton, realising a long unfulfilled hope of restoring the fledgling 13th century university.

Although the St George's Avenue Campus had to wait 70 years to see university status realised, the intervening decades provided strong foundations for today's University. This included the provision of part-time study towards degree qualifications under the auspices of first Cambridge, and then Leicester University.

However, by the early 1970s Northamptonshire found itself one of only three counties in England that didn't have a teacher training college. Although in a strong position to achieve this, it was felt that a stronger case could be made by amalgamation with an already established college. The opportunity which presented itself was a Liverpool college that had been made homeless after the Ministry of Defence reclaimed the site on which it had been established.

The Liverpool partner was Kirkby Fields College of Education. Effectively relocated 120 miles, and combined with the emerging







Northampton College, the joint venture found a home at Moulton Park in 1972.

To offset lean years in national teacher training provision, the Education College had to diversify, and the first stage was amalgamation with the Technical and Arts Colleges on St George's Avenue, Northampton, to form Nene College in 1975. In 1978 the National Leathersellers' Centre relocated to Northampton, and in 1981 the Blackwood Hodge (later Sunley) Management Centre opened.

The name chosen for the college was significant. The River Nene flowed through both town and county and was a link with the world beyond. It provided a strong sense of unification, which has continued in the University crest. Even after the Privy Council agreed the new institutional title of University College Northampton in February 1999, this unifying concept continued, binding the rising University to the enterprise and endeavour of Northampton and Northamptonshire.

In the early 1990s Nene acquired the last of its core subject areas: Health. As far back as 1981 it had acquired some health education from Milton Keynes College, and the School of Podiatry in 1989. In 1993 the college added St Andrew's School of Occupational Therapy, and in 1994, the Sir Gordon Roberts College of Nursing and Midwifery.

In August 2005 University College Northampton confirmed that it was to be awarded formal university status and full research degree awarding powers, becoming the University of Northampton. This development followed years of extensive work by staff across all levels at the University.

Today the University of Northampton looks forward to a bright future. In September 2018, the University welcomed the first cohort of students at the new, purpose-built Waterside Campus, having combined the learning, teaching and research facilities from the former two campuses to a new location in Northampton town centre, as part of the Northampton Waterside Enterprise Zone. As the county's only dedicated provider of higher education, the institution continues to build on its already well-established legacy by offering a complete educational, consultancy and research provision – from foundation and undergraduate level, through to postgraduate and doctoral qualifications.







The Honorands.

Conferment of an Honorary Doctorate Federico Brugnoli will be presented by John Sinclair at the ceremony on Saturday 12 February

Federico Brugnoli is one of the most distinguished consultants to the global fashion industry in the field of sustainability in the value chain. In this, he reflects the ethos of the Institute for Creative Leather Technologies and the wider University of Northampton: sustainability, international/global issues, innovation and strategic thinking.

A graduate of the University of Milan (MSc Environmental Sciences and Technologies, 1997), Federico has spent his career involved in projects focusing on sustainability, primarily in the leather sector. In particular, he has engaged in European projects with multinational partnerships in the fields of product and process innovation, international cooperation, development of export markets and energy efficiency of industrial production. He has also worked with the United Nations Industrial Development Organisation (UNIDO) as a consultant, culminating in 2012 with the presentation of the seminal paper, Life Cycle Assessment, Carbon Footprint in Leather Processing. Federico is currently working across the fashion and luxury goods fields with a range of well-known, high-end brands worldwide.

Conferment of an Honorary Fellowship Sylvia Hughes will be presented by Deborah Mattock at the ceremony on Saturday 12 February

Sylvia Hughes came to the University of Northampton as a Governor in 2010, subsequently becoming Deputy Chair and Chair of the Board of Governors, before retiring in 2019. The Board of Governors are a vital support to the University Executive for developing this community of learning from which you are about to graduate.

During her professional career, Sylvia held senior and board level positions at leading organisations such as Siemens, Cable and Wireless and the Halifax. She has worked across financial services, telecommunications, hi-tech, the service industry and fashion retail.

Particularly relevant to her role as governor, Sylvia pioneered the design and implementation of groundbreaking change management, organisational development and leadership programmes at national and global levels.

She is the author of the highly regarded report, Through the Looking Glass, Leadership Today, Leadership Tomorrow, which examines how strategic resourcing and leadership fit with organisational development and how it is managed in more than 40 major companies.

Sylvia's public service achievements and qualifications include her role as a Northamptonshire County Council Cabinet Member for Public Health, Chair of the County Health and Wellbeing Board and Chair of East Northants Council, as well as being a Chartered Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Personnel and Development.

As the Board level sponsor in the University's successful application to be the first Changemaker Campus in the UK, Sylvia was passionate about promoting this opportunity to embed Changemaker values into every aspect of University life. Sylvia genuinely embodies these values and her contribution to the development of Northampton as a world-leading Changemaker University is why we are honouring her today with a Fellowship.

Conferment of an Honorary Fellowship Andrew Scarborough will be presented by Professor Nick Petford at the ceremony on Saturday 12 February

Andrew Scarborough was Chair of the Board of Governors from 2014-2018, a period which included the construction and occupation of the Waterside Campus. Andrew was previously Deputy Chair of the Board of Governors and had served as a University Governor from 2009.

Andrew has lived in Northamptonshire since 1987. After many years working as a senior manager in the Post Office, he moved into non-executive roles in 2000, serving for eight years as Chairman of

Northamptonshire Healthcare NHS Trust and works as a Mental Health Act Manager to protect the rights of patients with mental illness detained in local hospitals. Andrew was a long-standing member of the Borough Council of Wellingborough, latterly serving as the Deputy Leader of the Opposition on the Shadow North Northamptonshire Council. He is a Justice of the Peace and is Chairman of the Northamptonshire Bench. He was also a member of the Board of the East Midlands Development Agency from 2000 to 2004.

Andrew is currently a Non-Executive Director of the Peterborough Diocese Education Trust. He is also a school governor at Rowan Gate Primary School in Wellingborough, where he was Chairman for seven years.

Outside of work and his voluntary activities, Andrew is a season ticket holder at Northampton Saints Rugby Club, is a keen follower of horseracing and an avid birdwatcher.

Conferment of an Honorary Bachelor of Arts Naz Islam will be presented by Karen Jones at the ceremony on Sunday 13 February

Naz Islam is a born and bred Northamptonian, whose family hails from Bangladesh. He has lived in Northampton all his life and attended Northampton School for Boys.

With a strong local connection and support for charities and third sector organisations, Naz exemplifies the values of the University. He is a keen community champion, a passionate supporter of local charities and was the proud winner of the 2013 Northampton Heart of the Community Award, presented by the Mayor of Northampton.

Naz's charitable and community work also reaches far beyond Northamptonshire boundaries. He is a co-director of the Government-funded charity, The Centre for Policy Promotion and Prevention, an NGO, which works on projects across the UK promoting community cooperation between marginal communities and the wider society. Naz has also helped fund and manage a family-run international orphanage and school in one of the poorest areas of Sylhet in Bangladesh, making a huge difference to peoples' lives and helping 150 children, many of whom live with disabilities.

The themes associated with the Coat of Arms are essentially concerned with the physical location of the University within the Borough of Northampton and the County of Northamptonshire, together with the central activities of the University.

The Borough is depicted in the left-hand supporter, a lion rampant, and in the central triple-turreted castle. It is also evident in the similar castle foot-stools for both supporters. The Main County reference is in the right-hand supporter of a bull with a golden chain, and is depicted in the Tudor rose held by the roebuck. The County colours of blue, green and silver are also a feature of the Coat of Arms.

The linking of Borough and County through the imagery of the River Nene is strongly pursued with two horizontal representations of the river, one on the central shield and one below the supporters.

The University's activities are reflected in the central feature of books of learning and the vocational technology perspective is illustrated by linked cogwheels. The University's concern with learning is nicely encapsulated in the motto 'Ne Nesciamus' – Let us not be ignorant'. Finally, The University's long association with the Worshipful Company of Leathersellers is depicted by the inclusion of the roebuck from its own coat of arms.
