Reverend Richard Coles | The Chancellor.



Reverend Richard Coles was born in Northampton and educated at Wellingborough School before studying Theology at King's College London. He later earned an MA by Research from the University of Leeds.

Ordained in 2005, he served as Vicar of St Mary the Virgin in Finedon, Northamptonshire until 2022. A familiar voice on BBC Radio 4, he co-hosted *Saturday Live* until March 2023 and remains a regular presence on popular television programmes including *Have I Got News for You*, *QI*, and *Countdown*. He also co-hosts the weekly podcast *The Rabbit Hole Detectives* alongside Earl Spencer and Dr Cat Jarman.

Reverend Coles has made memorable appearances on several entertainment TV shows, including *Strictly Come Dancing* in 2017, *Celebrity Masterchef* in 2016, and co-presenting *The Big Painting Challenge* in 2017. Richard has also regularly appeared in the *Pause for Thought* slot on the BBC Radio 2 Breakfast Show. In 2024, he joined the cast of *I'm a Celebrity... Get Me Out of Here!* and finished in third place. Earlier in his career, he was one half of the chart-topping 1980s pop duo The Communards, known for three top ten hits.

Passionate about housing and community development, he served for six years on the Board of Greatwell Homes, a provider of social and affordable housing in his former borough. In 2017, he transitioned from Board Member to Patron.

Reverend Coles is a prolific author whose non-fiction works span a wide range of subjects. His two Autobiographies, *Fathomless Riches* and *Bringing in the Sheaves* offer candid reflections on faith, fame and personal transformation. In *The Madness of Grief* he shares a deeply moving account of loss and mourning. Two collections on lesser-known saints, *Lives of the Improbable Saints* and *Legend of the Improbable Saints*. A travelogue, *Coles to Jerusalem* and *The Rabbit Hole Book* a collection of trivia and unexpected facts.

In addition to his non-fiction, Reverend Coles is the creator of the acclaimed *Canon Clement Mysteries*, a crime fiction series featuring the titles, *Murder before Evensong*, *A Death in the Parish*, *Murder at the Monastery*, *Murder Under the Mistletoe* and *A Death on Location*. The first novel in this series was recently adapted for television and premiered in the UK on Channel 5 in October 2025.

In recognition of his contributions, he was awarded honorary doctorates from the University of Northampton in 2012 and the University of Warwick in 2016.

Reverend Coles moved to East Sussex in May 2022. He said: "I'll be living in a charming 18th-century cottage with a bow window that looms over the street affording a privileged view of my neighbours' comings and goings, as the scent of lavender floats across the village green."

Dallas Campbell | Pro Chancellor.



Dallas is on a mission to take science out of the lab and into people's lives, but he completed his undergraduate degree in Drama at Nene College, an antecedent institution of the University of Northampton, in 1992.

For nearly two decades he's been at the forefront of popular science in the UK. He's presented many of the highest profile factual programmes on television, programmes which lift the curtain on our human planet, aimed at audiences of all ages and backgrounds. These include *Bang Goes the Theory*, *The Gadget Show*, *The Sky at Night*, *Stargazing Live*, *Supersized Earth*, *Time Scanners*, *The Science of Stupid*, *Britain Beneath Your Feet*, *Horizon*, and many more. These productions

have taken him to some of the most fascinating and extreme places on Earth, from the top of the Burj Khalifa, to the bottom of a Mexican sewer, to rocket launches in Kazakhstan and everything in between.

Inform, educate and entertain is at the heart of everything Dallas does. Beyond television, he works tirelessly as a STEM ambassador and has been involved with hundreds of educational initiatives world-wide, encouraging young people to think creatively about science and technology, and to embrace the pleasures of finding things out!

His podcast *Patented: History of Inventions* explores the history of technology and invention. His debut book *Ad Astra: An Illustrated Guide to Leaving the Planet* was published in 2017 and he is currently writing his second book on the history of space flight.

Mark Lawson | Pro Chancellor.



Mark Lawson was born in Hendon and raised in Leeds. He took his undergraduate degree in English at University College London and became a freelance contributor to numerous publications including the *Roman Catholic publication*, *The Universe* and *The Times*. Since 1995, Mark has written for *The Guardian* but has also written for *The Independent* and has twice been TV Critic of the Year, as well as winning many other journalism awards.

Specialising in culture and the arts, Mark is best known for presenting the flagship BBC Radio 4 arts programme *Front Row* between 1998 and 2014. He is also a Guardian columnist, and presented 'Mark Lawson Talks To...' on BBC Four from 2006 to 2015.

Lawson presented *The Late Show* on BBC2 in the 1990s. In 2004, Lawson made a documentary for BBC Four called *The Truth About Sixties TV*, criticising what he called 'golden ageists' who, he said, have a rose-tinted view of television's past.

In addition to his work in print journalism and the broadcast media, Mark has written five books, both fiction and non-fiction. His first, *Bloody Margaret* is a collection of novellas on late 20th-century politics in the UK, including an eponymous satire concerning Margaret Thatcher. This was followed by *The Battle for Room Service*, a travelogue of people, politics and culture encountered by Mark as a journalist.

His 1995 book *Idlewild* is an alternative history novel in which both John F. Kennedy and Marilyn Monroe survived the 1960s. *Going Out Live* focused on contemporary celebrity culture and the media, and *Enough is Enough* is a satire set in the government of Harold Wilson during the late 1960s. In his 2016 novel *The Allegations*, a lecturer at a fictional English university faces disciplinary action and dismissal for bullying and harassment.

In his spare time Mark also supports Northampton Town Football Club.

Lady Phyll | Pro Chancellor.



Phyll Opoku-Gyimah is the nucleus of the award-winning celebration and protest that is UK Black Pride. Founded in 2005, UK Black Pride is Europe's largest celebration for LGBTQI+ people of African, Asian, Caribbean, Middle Eastern and Latin American descent, and is a safe space to celebrate diverse sexualities, gender identities, gender expressions and cultures. UK Black Pride organises an annual celebration during pride month, as well as a variety of activities throughout the year, which promote and advocate for the spiritual, emotional and intellectual health and wellbeing of the communities it represents.

Widely known as Lady Phyll - partly due to her decision to reject an MBE in the New Year's Honours' list to protest Britain's role in formulating anti-LGBTQI+ penal codes across its empire - she was also the executive director of Kaleidoscope Trust, an organisation working to uphold the human rights of LGBTQI+ people around the world. She is a community builder and organiser; an Albert Kennedy Trust patron, and a public speaker focusing on race, gender, sexuality and class.

Lady Phyll's over two decades of dedication to human rights advocacy have left an indelible mark. She's regularly called upon to advise nascent LGBTQI+ organisations around the world to help leaders create cogent organising strategies, establish robust partnership networks and work effectively in service of the LGBTQI+ community and inspire all who strive for equality and justice.

Lady Phyll is also the Secretary for TCEN - The Commonwealth Equality Network; a network of organisations challenging inequality based on sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, and sex characteristics. The Network was set up to give a global voice to LGBTQI+ communities across the Commonwealth and to support joint advocacy to provide an answer to the colonial legacy of homophobia - a Commonwealth solution to a Commonwealth problem.

Morcea Walker | Pro Chancellor.



Born on the island of Jamaica, Morcea has always been proud of her heritage. Aged nine she moved to Great Britain. Her time in Jamaica and the years spent on her own, certainly impacted on her life. It helped give her feelings of belonging and helping.

Morcea has taught in various types of Secondary schools. Teaching is a passion that has driven Morcea throughout her adult life. Morcea believes that working with young people should be treated as a privilege, a joy to be part of opening minds and learning from them.

As an Advisory Teacher (Equalities) Morcea used the Arts as a platform for learning. This has meant that she has promoted the whole issue of gender, race, disability etc through this medium. Morcea became the Co-ordinator for Supplementary Schools in Northamptonshire, and this remains her favourite activity – apart from being a wife, mum, and grandmother! These schools run language and cultural classes including Arabic, Chinese, Polish, African Caribbean, Russian and Gujarati. Her three children are all in jobs that serve the community and are quietly doing their own volunteering as appropriate. Morcea has a true love of the county of Northamptonshire – it's exciting history, parks, countryside, events, towns and much more. Morcea is a Governor at a local school and a Trustee at a number of organisations including Northamptonshire Music and Performing Arts Trust, Northamptonshire Black History Association, Healthwatch – West and North Northamptonshire, Street Pastors and Community Law.

Morcea was awarded an MBE in 2012, appointed as a Deputy Lieutenant in 2017 and was Vice-Lord-Lieutenant of Northamptonshire from 2022-2024

Anne-Marie Kilday | The Vice Chancellor.



Professor Anne-Marie Kilday is Vice Chancellor and Professor of Criminal History at the University of Northampton.

She writes and researches on various aspects of criminal history, particularly focusing on violent behaviour and gendered criminality.

Professor Kilday started her academic career in Scotland working at the University of Strathclyde and then the University of Glasgow. She joined Oxford Brookes University in 2000 as a Lecturer in Early Modern History and progressed her career at the University securing various promotions from Principal Lecturer through to Dean. She was promoted into the senior

leadership team becoming the Pro Vice-Chancellor for Research and Knowledge Transfer and Impact in 2012 and then became Pro Vice-Chancellor Student Experience & University Community, with institutional responsibility for all aspects of both student and staff experience in 2018 and continued in that role until she left for the University.

Anne-Marie enjoys supporting Oxford United and Celtic football clubs, playing table tennis, reading true crime and crime fiction, and chasing after her five cats Duncan, Angus, Vasquez, Rori and Boo, and her three dogs Aeryn, Brodie and Vada!

Becky Bradshaw | Deputy Vice Chancellor and Chief Operating Officer.



Becky has worked in the higher education sector for over 20 years taking her current position as Deputy Vice Chancellor and Chief Operating Officer at the University of Northampton in 2023. Becky has institutional responsibility for strategic operations, supporting the Vice Chancellor with development and delivering of the University's strategy, and providing strategic leadership and oversight to the majority of professional services.

Becky has a background in health, safety and risk management, and led the operationalisation of the University of Northampton's new and innovative Waterside Campus, alongside their strategic response to the Coronavirus

pandemic. She is passionate about social impact, the influence of Universities on their local and regional communities and economies, and the positive impact of professional services on the student experience, in addition to sustainability and environmental improvement, and has led development of both the University's Sustainability and Estates strategies.

Andy Burman | Chair, Board of Governors.



Andy is a graduate of Sheffield Hallam University, where he was also a Students' Union Vice President. Since then, he has a work history spanning central and local government, the NHS, the not-for-profit sector and working closely with the Higher Education sector. He was previously CEO of the British Dietetic Association for nearly 20 years and has over 10 years' experience as a governance expert: advising the not-for-profit sector both in the UK and internationally.

He holds several trustee and Non-Executive Director and advisory positions on Boards of charities and companies in the UK. He has worked in the health

sector for over 25 years, is a visiting lecturer on governance and ethics and speaks both nationally and internationally on Board development and governance for professional and membership bodies. In addition, he has been involved with key strategic government projects and reviews in recent years. He was involved with the implementation of the Nightingale Hospitals at the start of the COVID-19 pandemic and was a member of the Board leading the review of NHS Hospital Food.

Andy has a long history with Northampton, having lived in the area previously but is still a regular supporter at Northampton Saints RFC.

1261-1265

Northampton sanctioned by Henry III as an alternative place to study for students displaced from Oxford and Cambridge universities during a period of civil unrest.

1911

Science & Technology found their first formal home in the old Northampton Grammar School premises at Abington Square & Art settled nearby in Abington Street.

1924

Plans were underway for a purpose-built College of Technology.



1932

The College of Technology on St George's Avenue Campus formally opened.



1972

The emerging Northampton College partners with Kirkby Fields College of Education in Moulton Park for teacher training.

1975

Amalgamation of the College of Education with the College of Art and Technology to form Nene College.



1937

The College of Art opened at St George's Campus.



1978

The National Leathersellers' Centre relocated to Northampton

1993 - 1994

The college added St Andrew's School of Occupational Therapy & Sir Gordon Roberts College of Nursing and Midwifery to the school of health.



August 2005

University College Northampton is awarded formal university status and full research degree awarding powers becoming the University of Northampton.

1981

Blackwood Hodge (later Sunley) Management Centre opens.



Early 1990's

Nene acquired the last of its core subject areas: Health.



1999

NOVEMBER 2025

The University of Northampton is celebrating the success of three graduates who have each been awarded scholarships from the Chartered Financial Analyst (CFA) Institute, one of the most respected professional bodies in global finance. These scholarships recognise academic excellence, ambition, and commitment to professional development.

The recipients—Ashanté-Paisley Temeng, Anastasija Gore, and Auranut Areechalerm graduated from UON's BSc Finance and International Finance programmes

Dr I-Chen Jennifer Lu, Programme Leader for BSc Finance at UON, praised the graduates: "Their stories reflect determination, adaptability, and ambition. The CFA scholarships are key milestones that will help them make a meaningful impact in the financial sector."



NOVEMBER 2025

Student journalists from the University of Northampton have celebrated a major double victory at this year's Broadcast Journalism Training Council (BJTC) Awards, bringing home two national honours.

Judged by industry leaders and recognising the best of UK journalism training, from more than 170 submissions across the country, two University of Northampton entries claimed top prizes.

The first award went to Sophie Smith, who graduated in Multimedia Sports Journalism. Sophie won 'Best TV Sport Journalism' for her powerful documentary exploring double above-knee amputee snowboarders and their campaign for a dedicated classification at the Winter Paralympics.

The second win of the night came in the 'Best Radio Newscast' category, awarded to a team of Multimedia Journalism students. Working in partnership with NLive Radio, the team produced in-depth, real-time coverage of the West Northamptonshire Council elections in May 2025.



DECEMBER 2025

In recognition of his outstanding contribution to student representation and leadership, a University of Northampton student has been named as the Student Leader of the Year. Muhammed Hafiz, known to friends and colleagues as Hafiz, picked up his award during UK Council for International Student Affairs (UK CISA) Awards Ceremony in London last month.

UK CISA is an independent, UK-based charity and membership organisation which is committed to making sure international students have the best possible experience of UK higher education. There were 420 nominations for the #WeAreInternational Awards, with only 13 winners chosen including Hafiz.

Reflecting on the award, Hafiz said: "I never imagined I'd win; it's one of the proudest moments of my life. This recognition isn't just for me—it's for the incredible collaboration that made these achievements possible."



DECEMBER 2025

A popular University health degree has been given the 'thumbs up' from a national organisation that reflects educational excellence and quality. The BSc Paramedic Science degree has again been formally endorsed by the College of Paramedics, up until 31 October 2028.

Endorsement from the College recognises a commitment from the University to maintain the highest standards in pre-registration paramedic education.

Danielle Neighbour, Senior Lecturer in Paramedic Science, says: "We are delighted to have official endorsement from our professional body, a reflection of how we align not only with the College's vision for paramedics, but also the quality of teaching we provide at University of Northampton."

JANUARY 2026

History has been made by one student at the University of Northampton, whose research has rediscovered a local species of moth which hasn't been spotted in the county for more than 80 years.

Biological Sciences student, Jamie Waller embarked on her dissertation research at local heritage site, Delapré Abbey to ethically trap (and release) moths in a bid to identify the insect's community, record which species were present.

After logging her research findings with local active field group, Northamptonshire Moth Group (and after being verified by a county moth reporter) Jamie was shocked to find she had made a monumental discovery – having logged the first sighting of a Hollyhock Seed Moth (*Pexicopia malvella*) since 1940.

Prior to 1940, there has only ever been three previous local records dating back to 1906.

"It's feels great to have contributed something to my local town in a field I'm passionate about, and in an area which is so often underappreciated. Through my studies, I've discovered a new passion, and I look forward to continuing moth-sighting as a hobby."



FEBRUARY 2026

This academic year, University of Northampton celebrates half a century increasing our understanding of how people live, love and labour, at home and beyond.

Sociology – the social science that interrogates and explains how humans and social structures and phenomena interact – at UON has had a significant presence since 1975.

The most recent Discover Uni figures show that 100% of UON Sociology students value the support from their academics and 100% also feel the degree has helped them develop the knowledge and skills they need for their future.

Andrew Pilkington, Emeritus Professor, was with Sociology from the start, commencing his career in Higher Education in Northampton in 1974.

Andrew, who was Head of Sociology at Nene College from 1976 – 1993 says: "From quite humble origins, Sociology at UON has made over half a century of critical thinking and understanding how people live, love and labour at home and beyond."



MARCH 2026

A quest to 'save the world' took an unexpected turn when one student from the University of Northampton discovered a rare, extinction-threatened mushroom during a biodiversity survey at local nature reserve, Stanwick Lakes.

Environmental Science student, Tom Haddon, has recorded the first-ever sighting of a rare 'wrinkled peach' (*rhodotus palmatus*) fungus within Northamptonshire – a species listed as vulnerable to extinction on the global International Union for Conservation of Nature Red List – during his eight-week biodiversity survey at Stanwick Lakes.

"The wrinkled peach was literally the 2,000th mushroom I counted, meaning my final find was arguably the most significant," Tom explains. "It's vulnerable to extinction globally, which is fairly astounding."

"When I started studying, I wanted to save the world. Now, I'll settle for saving the mushrooms."



MARCH 2026

A University of Northampton graduate is thriving behind the scenes of one of the UK's best-known television productions, after turning her passion for engineering into a career in broadcast technology.

Mirusha Jegatheeswaran, who studied Computer Systems Engineering at the University of Northampton, is now working as a Broadcast and Media Systems Engineer for Emmerdale at ITV.

Since joining ITV more than six years ago, Mirusha has worked on major productions including Coronation Street, completed night shoots on location, and regularly receives on-screen credits under Technical Support.

Her advice to current students and graduates is simple: be authentic, apply even if you don't meet every requirement, and don't be afraid to admit what you don't know.

Conferment of an Honorary Fellowship

Nathan Ghann will be presented by Kahvan Bryan at a ceremony on Tuesday 28 April.

Nathan Ghann is a Student Success Practitioner, Higher Education Consultant and Public Speaker. His academic journey began with significant challenges; once labelled an “at risk” student, he overcame both personal and academic setbacks to earn a First-Class Honours degree in Economics and Marketing. His remarkable transformation led to national recognition as one of the Top Ten Most Outstanding Graduates in the UK, celebrated at the House of Lords.

Nathan is the founder of The Educate Group, an organisation that partners with universities to improve student retention and success.

Through this work, Nathan supports institutions in developing strategies to identify and assist students who may be at risk of disengagement or dropping out. In addition to his consultancy, he works as a speaker, sharing his experience and expertise with institutions that are striving to better support underrepresented or struggling students.

Nathan is also a committed advocate for equity, diversity and inclusion within higher education governance. His mission is rooted in a passion for systemic change and personal resilience, using his own story as a catalyst to inspire both institutional reform and individual transformation.



Rachel Mallows

Conferment of an Honorary Fellowship

Rachel Mallows will be presented by Helen Miller at a ceremony on Wednesday 29 April.

Rachel Mallows is a prominent figure in Northamptonshire, known for her extensive experience in business and community support. Rachel was born in Northampton and grew up in Abington where her parents had a fish and chip shop on Birchfield Road East. At the age of eight her family moved to Bozeat near Wellingborough. In essence, she is a local girl with a love for Northamptonshire.

Rachel's career began in Northampton working for Mettoy (Corgi cars) in the Sales Department and then on to Harper & Tunstall in Wellingborough in the office of the Managing Director. She started her own business in the 1980's providing administrative and accounts support to small businesses. Conferment of an Honorary Fellowship

Sue Dutton will be presented by Anne-Marie Kilday at a ceremony on Thursday 30 April.

Dr Sue Dutton has extensive teaching and managerial experience in education. Sue began her professional career teaching English in state secondary schools in Surrey, Berkshire and Hampshire. In 1989 she relocated to Northamptonshire where she took up posts in local secondary schools and further education colleges before moving to The Open University in Milton Keynes. Here she was appointed to senior administrative roles in Student Services, finally becoming Director of Strategy, Planning and Resources in the Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences.

Her academic research interests and doctorate focused on the factors that attract and retain young students at The Open University. Following retirement from the University, Sue worked as a psychotherapist with adults and young people. Sue joined the University of Northampton's Board of Governors in 2015 and completed a full nine-year term, which included a period as Deputy Chair and Acting Chair of the Board, in 2023. Her outside interests mainly centre around music, particularly choral singing.

Celebration of University Professors.

The title of Professor recognises an individual's high levels of achievements and standing in their particular area or discipline. Professors have to demonstrate a major contribution to knowledge through either research or consultancy, to teaching, learning and development, or to professional achievement and practice.

Professor appointments demonstrate the University's growing excellence in research, enterprise and professional practice and are key in supporting the University's ambitions for research and knowledge exchange. The University, our students and communities locally, nationally and further afield benefit from the expertise and commitment these individuals have demonstrated.

Professor of Social Justice, Claire Paterson-Young.



Claire began her career in Scotland within the youth and restorative justice sector, where she developed extensive experience working directly with justice-involved children and young people. She later relocated to England to take up a specialist role as a Child Sexual Exploitation Coordinator, working across multi-agency safeguarding partnerships to develop and implement strategic responses to exploitation, abuse, and violence. Across these roles, she accumulated substantial experience in youth justice, safeguarding, and systems coordination, shaping a practice-informed perspective that

remains central to her academic work. In 2015, Claire joined the University of Northampton, marking a transition into academia that was foregrounded in her practice expertise. She completed her PhD in 2018, establishing a programme of research concerned with how the impact of interventions in the youth justice system are conceptualised, measured, and understood. Since then, she has progressed from Senior Research to Research Leader at the Institute for Social Innovation and Impact (ISII).

Claire's research is characterised by its methodological innovation and critical engagement with the complexities of evaluating social justice. Her scholarship engages with intersecting areas including youth justice, child protection, trauma-informed practice, and the criminalisation of vulnerability. Increasingly, her work also interrogates the ethical and social implications of emerging technologies, including the use of artificial intelligence in policing and law enforcement. She has held a position as Research Associate at the Children and Young People's Centre for Justice, contributing to research and policy development in youth justice, and was previously a Visiting Fellow at BINUS University, where she engaged in international collaboration and knowledge exchange. She is currently a Research Affiliate of the Vulnerability & Policing Futures Research Centre, reflecting her ongoing involvement in interdisciplinary research addressing vulnerability, harm, and the future of policing.

Alongside her research, Claire has played a significant role in academic leadership and governance, including contributions to research ethics and editorial work across the fields of criminology, youth studies, and social policy. Her work is consistently characterised by participatory methodologies, foregrounding the voices and experiences of those most affected by social injustice. Taken together, Claire's career reflects a trajectory from practitioner to academic, marked by a sustained commitment to bridging research, policy, and practice. Her work continues to shape critical debates on social justice, particularly in relation to how systems respond to, and often reproduce, the vulnerabilities of children and young people.

ACADEMIC DRESS BASICS

- Academic caps will vary based on degree level, with mortarboards (square caps) being worn for graduates up to the doctoral level. Doctoral graduates will typically wear a cloth or velvet bonnet with a coloured tassel.
- Hood colours represent both the institution and its faculties. For example, the blue in the image to the right represents the University of Northampton, with the red representing the Faculty of Arts.
- Hood shapes will differ based on the level of the degree. Undergraduates will typically have a simple-shaped hood, while postgraduates will typically have a more complex or full-shaped hood.
- Gown shapes and colours will indicate different degree levels. For example, bachelors degrees will typically have simpler pointed sleeves, while masters degrees will have longer, more elaborate sleeves.

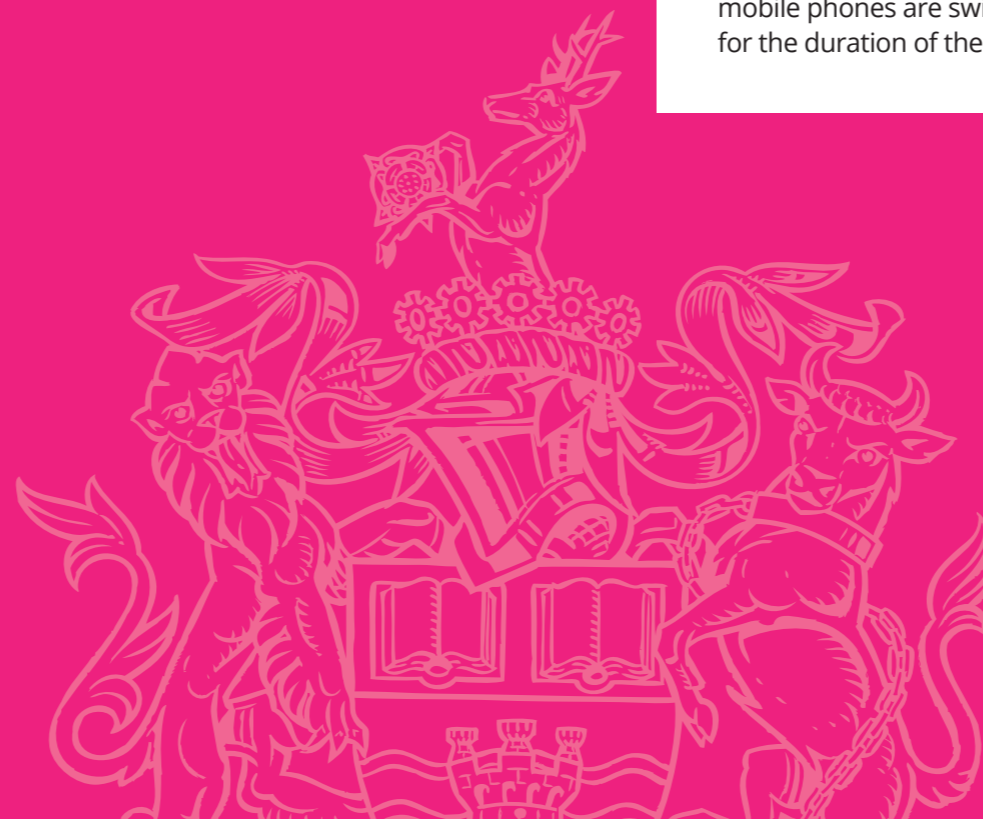

Coat of Arms.



The themes associated with the Coat of arms are essentially concerned with the physical location of the University within the Borough of Northampton and the County of Northamptonshire, together with the central activities of the University.

The Borough is depicted in the left-hand supporter, a lion rampant, and in the central triple-turreted castle. It is also evident in the similar castle footstools for both supporters. The Main County reference is in the right-hand supporter of a bull with a golden chain and is depicted in the Tudor rose held by the roebuck. The County colours of blue, green and silver are also a feature of the Coat of Arms.

The linking of Borough and County through the imagery of the River Nene is strongly pursued with two horizontal representations of the river, one on the central shield and one below the supporters.

The University's activities are reflected in the central feature of books of learning, and the vocational technology perspective is illustrated by linked cogwheels. The University's concern with learning is nicely encapsulated in the motto 'Ne Nesciamus' - Let us not be ignorant'. The first four letters spelling Nene, for Nene College, an antecedent institution title of the University of Northampton.

Finally, The University's long association with the Worshipful Company of Leathersellers is depicted by the inclusion of the roebuck from its own coat of arms.
